Your community's students are depending on your VOTE.



What is your voting plan?







Register to vote.



Remember to check your registration information before your state's voter registration deadline. That could be up to 30 days before the election. This gives you time if you need to re-register or make changes.

Each state makes its own voting rules, including how to confirm your registration. All state election offices and many local election offices have websites with information about voting, including what's on your ballot, where your polling place is located, and how you can request a ballot in the mail. Check with your state or local elections office to get the most detailed and up-todate information about where you vote.

election other than in-person at a voting location. This process is also called **absentee voting** in some communities. Each state has its own rules on who can vote by mail. Some states require an excuse to vote by mail, while other states automatically mail every registered voter a ballot before an election. Examples of excuses may include illness, injury, disability, traveling outside of your jurisdiction or locality on Election Day, being a college student, or serving in the military.

In-person voting typically takes place at a polling place on Election Day, but voters may have the option to vote before Election Day at a polling location, vote center, or elections office. Contact your local elections office for more information about upcoming election dates, polling hours, and in-person voting options.

Make your plan.

Here are a few things to consider adding to your voting plan:

6 weeks before Election Day

Check your voter registration status. If you have moved since the last time you voted, make sure your information is up to date.

4 weeks before Election Day

Decide which voting option works best for you. If you would like to vote by mail (and you are eligible in your state), request your ballot today.

2 weeks before Election Day

If you are not eligible to vote by mail, or if you prefer to vote in person, check with your local elections office to see if you can vote in-person before Election Day.

Election Day

Go vote! Check with your local elections office for hours and locations.
